Transition to Fifth Grade

Homework

MATH - GoMath Standards Practice Book problems will align with the current GoMath unit. Simple Solutions will cycle through multiple review topics.

READING - Read at least 20 minutes a day and prepare thoughtful responses. Progress will be gauged through weekly journal entries rather than reading logs.

EXPRESSION - Spelling and vocabulary tests will alternate. Study the spelling or vocabulary words each night and complete a daily lesson in Simple Solutions.

RELIGION - Study for unit tests and memorize prayers and Bible verses.

SCIENCE & SOCIAL STUDIES - Refer to Ms. Gutjahr.
